April 6

Trapunto Decor for T-shirt, Sweat Shirt or Quilt Top Barbara Rogers

There will be a demo showing you how to add trapunto shapes to blank areas of your quilt top. Also you will decorate the front of your t-shirt or sweat shirt with a simple trapunto design. A variety of images will be supplied. This technique can be used in many projects.

Supplies:

- Sewing machine & basic supplies (see note below)
- o t-shirt, turtleneck, or sweat shirt with a plain front
- Sewing machine must be capable of free motion sewing
- Darning foot
- Blunt point scissors (child's scissors work well)
- Bobbin thread will show on front of your shirt. So choose a decorative or contrasting thread of your choice. Heavy and metallic threads work well. There will also be a variety of specialty threads for you to wind onto your bobbin so don't sweat it!
- Top thread can be any neutral.
- If you have a free motion grip guide, bring it.

Bento Box

You'll be surprised at how easy these blocks are to make. Determining fabric needed for a quilt is easy math, as each block requires only two jelly roll strips. You'll have time to finish at least one block at the meeting.

Supplies:

- Sewing machine & basic supplies (see note below)
- Two strips of 2 ½" by WOF (width of fabric) of two contrasting fabrics (or use what we will have available to make a block for a Cuddle Care quilt).

DAY PROGRAMS

April 20, 10am-2pm

Cuddle Care Brown Bear Appliqué, Vivian Armstrong (pictured at right)

Vivian will show us how to appliqué a brown bear on a background fabric, using lighter fabric to highlight where the sun is shining on the bear. In the picture shown, the bear is coming out of his damp, shimmery cave into the sun.

Background fabric, bear parts (ready to iron on), and stabilizer will be provided.

Supplies:

- Sewing machine and basic supplies (see note below)
- A sewing machine (or needle and thread if you prefer to hand appliqué)
- Thread of various shades of brown (dark, light, yellowish, goldish, etc.) and neutrals (sand, beige, cream, coffee, etc.)
- o Iron and ironing mat

There will be refreshments and door prizes! Be sure to sign-up or contact Vivian so kits can be prepared.

Friendship Star Wreath, Susan Wolfe (pictured at right) Supplies:

- 1 yard background fabric
- Leftovers from another project; or a 15" x 5-1/2" scrap; or an 11" x 10" square.
- 8 accent fabrics, basically enough fabric to make:
 (2) 5-1/4" squares and (1) 4-1/2" square
- o 1/4 to 1/3 yard coordinating fabric for binding
- Sewing machine & basic supplies (see note below)
- 4-1/2 square ruler or similar tool for squaring up blocks



Friendship Star Wreath

Pre-class cutting instructions:

From background fabric cut:

- o (2) strips 5-1/4" by WOF, crosscut into 16 5-1/4" squares
- o (1) strip 4-1/2" by WOF, crosscut into 8 4-1/2" squares**
- (1) strip 4-1/2" by WOF, crosscut to create (1) 4-1/2"x16-1/2" rectangle and (1) 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangle (bring all extra material to class with you)
- (1) strip 14" x WOF (crosscut instructions will be provided at class)

From each of 8 accent fabrics cut:

o (2) 5-1/4" squares and (1) 4-1/2" square

June 15, 10am-2pm

Quilt of Valor Quilting Bee, Vivian Armstrong

Together we will create a one of a kind patriotic quilt to cover a local service member or veteran touched by war with a comforting and healing Quilt of Valor. The pattern and fabric will be provided. Bring your basic sewing supplies (see note below) including neutral thread, and a brown bag lunch.

<u>Note</u>: Sewing machine & basic supplies = Machine, manual and tools, extra needles, thread, bobbins, pins, scissors, seam ripper, rotary cutter, small cutting board (12x18), rulers, ironing mat and extension cords.

Rules


- Following the monthly theme, bring 3-6 strips that are 2 ½ wide by width of fabric.

Just in case you were not aware, several classes are sponsored by LNT and its members. LNT, Marilou Jacobs (Needle Arts Center), Susan Wolfe and I each sponsor classes at the fair. LNT also provides a great demo during the fair. (More information will be forthcoming so you will have the information you need to participate during this year's "LNT Day at the Fair".)

This year's Featured Category is "How does your quilt tell a story? Quilts as History". This will be a judged exhibit of quilts from our recent past (1960's - 1990's). Any technique, style, size, or fabric will be accepted. A story of how the quilt relates to you must be included and will be displayed with the quilts. The exhibit will show how quilts have influenced our lives and how they have become part of our family.

Cuddle Care Workshops

Our quilting group loves to bless the community with the joy only a quilt can bring. Join us as we stitch love covers for the patients of Norton Children's Hospital and other charitable causes. We also make tote bags for the girls at Maryhurst. No sewing experience necessary, just come ready to help and bring a machine if you have one!

LNT has a large stash of assorted 100% cotton fabrics that we can assemble as "kits" for members to use through the year. Cutting and planning not your thing? Bring a cuddle care project that you already have in the works and sew away! Bring a brown bag lunch.

Tips & Tricks

Quilter's Moonshine Recipe (pressing spray)

Mix well:

- 1 gallon of distilled water
- 1/2 cup liquid starch (such as Sta-Flo)
- 1 cup vodka (cheap is fine)
- up to 4 teaspoons of your favorite essential oil for scent, optional

Mix ingredients in large container. Pour into spray bottles. Recipe may be cut in half.

When changing sewing machine needles, leave the needle threaded during removal to prevent the needle from dropping into the inner workings of your machine. When replacing the new needle, thread it first. It is easier to thread and will prevent needle from dropping into machine at that point as well.
