

## EVENING PROGRAMS 6:30pm - until our bobbin thread runs out

## October 5

Stencil Discharge Dye (Susan Hoferkamp)

Susan will demonstrate a two-part surface design technique for fabric. Part one is a discharge dye technique whereas a bleaching agent is used to remove the dye using a stencil on pre-dyed fabric. Part two entails coloring the discharged area with colored pencil, paint, or markers. She will bring the blocks for us to work on and the bleaching agent as well as some pencils, markers, and paints to share. You are welcome to bring your own colored pencils, children's water colors, or fabric crayons in order to jump right in to the process.

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## November 2

Origami Dresden Plate (Susan Wolfe)

#### **Supplies:**

- Center Flower 9 inch square of fabric
- Button- 1 inch shank button to cover stitching and create 3D effect
- Petals- 20 (Twenty) 2-3/4 x 5-1/2 inch strips in colors of your choice
- Background Fabric- 16-1/2 inch square to compliment / contrast with center flower
- 16-1/2 to 17 inch square of batting
- o 17 inch square of fabric for the backing
- Matching Thread
- Basic sewing supplies

#### Pre-Class cutting instructions: Templates available upon sign-up.

Trace Hexagon shape onto the 9" center fabric and trim. On the WRONG side of the fabric mark the center point of each of the six sides.

Trace Petal shape onto the 20 (twenty) 2-3/4" x 5-1/2" strips and trim.

## DAY PROGRAMS

## October 19, 10am-2pm

## Thread Painting (Barbara Rogers)

Our own artist in residence, Barbara Rogers, will be teaching thread painting! She will bring samples of her work and will demonstrate a few techniques to get us started. In addition to the supplies listed below you will need to sketch (or trace) a simple image (butterfly, flower, etc.) onto white cotton fabric that has been stabilized with two layers of fusible stabilizer. Barbara will also have a few images to share if you like.

#### Supplies:

- Sewing machine set up for free motion stitching
- Topstitch needle
- o Bobbin (or two) filled with invisible thread
- Several assorted colored threads to "paint" your image

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## November 16, 10am-2pm

## Dresden Neighborhood (Mary Bauer)

Learn to make a whimsical Dresden plate variation that turns the wedges into a housing neighborhood. You can plan to make a single block and turn that into a pillow, or make three blocks for a table runner and six blocks for a small quilt.



#### **Materials Needed:**

#### For a Pillow:

- o Background fabric for a 20" pillow
- Scraps for the houses at least 4" x 8"
- Smaller scraps for the roof, doors, windows
- o ¼ yd. of your favorite fusible
- o 1/8 yd. Heat n Bond Ultra Hold

#### For Table Runner:

- o 2 yds. Background & Backing
- 1/8 yd. each 11 to 12 different fabrics for houses and binding
- Scraps for the roofs, doors and windows
- o 1/2 yd. Heat n Bond Lite
- o ¼ yd. Heat n Bond Ultra Hold
- For Small Quilt: (list does not include backing)
- o 2 ¾ yds Background
- Assorted scraps for houses (minimum 4"x8"), roofs, doors and windows
- ½ yd Black & White Houses print
- 1 ¼ yd Wonder Under

#### Supplies:

- Sewing machine with a ¼" piecing foot and an open toe applique foot
- o Paper & Fabric scissors
- o Rotary for fabric and another for paper
- Monofilament thread
- Dresden ruler and/or freezer paper\*
- Sewing machine & basic supplies
- Rotating cutting mat is helpful

#### **Preparation:**

Pre-wash all fabric that will be used with fusibles (roof, doors and windows).

REMEMBER: There will be no day program for December!

Asking A seamstress to mend, is like asking Picasso to paint your garage!

<u>Note</u>: Sewing machine & basic supplies = Machine, manual and tools, extra needles, thread, bobbins, pins, scissors, seam ripper, rotary cutter, small cutting board (12x18), rulers, ironing mat and extension cords.

<sup>\*</sup>Bring freezer paper if you wish to learn how to make a Dresden without a ruler.

Buttons and patches and the cold wind blowing, the days pass quickly when I am sewing.

#### TIPS & TRICKS

- Rather than handling a sharp rotary cutter blade with your fingers when changing to a new blade, use a small magnet to remove the old one as well as to replace the new one.
- When disposing of dull rotary cutter blades, put them into a small tin, such as a lozenge tin. When the tin becomes full of old blades tape it securely and toss it into the trash.
- Dull rotary cutter blades are still sharp enough to cut paper. Purchase another cutter and mark it for paper only!
