




February 1 6:30-8:30

Meet Our Quilt of Valor Recipient

Linda Bashears, a Seneca High School graduate, joined the Army in 1974 and served three years active duty as a medic. She ended her active status, returned to Louisville and enlisted in the Kentucky Army National Guard, again as a medic, until 1988.

Linda moved to Illinois to raise a son but considered reenlisting after 9/11 and then again in 2003 after she had moved back to Louisville and was working at the Robley Rex VA Medical Center. Linda was one of the first contacts for many servicemen and women returning from Iraq, and she felt she could be of more service if she reenlisted. And so she did -- joining the Army Reserves on her 50th birthday, June 11, 2004.

Linda was deployed to Iraq in December 2005 after having been trained as a Postal Supervisor. Her unit was assigned to a post office on a Forward Operating Base whose Ammo Holding Area was hit by a mortar resulting in loud explosions for several hours. Linda was close to the center of the blast and suffered a Moderate Traumatic Brain Injury resulting in balance, hearing, skeletal and PTSD issues.

Linda has had several shoulder and back surgeries and continues to be challenged by PTSD. She received a Purple Heart for wounds suffered in a combat situation.

Linda enjoyed being a liaison between troops returning from Iraq and Afghanistan and the Brain Injury Alliance of Kentucky before returning to Illinois to fill her new role as grandmother.

TIPS & TRICKS

➤ I read an article about a lady who made a **memory quilt** for herself after saving a 2-1/2" (or pick-a-size) square from each fabric she had used in making a quilt. The lady would sit under her memory quilt and remember the quilts and the reasons and the recipients as she pondered each fabric.

- ➢ If you are having trouble remembering how to join binding, make a sample of binding join technique so you will have reference.
- Use the thin plastic cutting boards (mats) to cut templates. They are durable and have a non-slip side.
