

This will be a demo/lecture program. No need to bring any sewing supplies.

Tamila will discuss the steps involved in the reverse appliqué process, including:

- providing examples of when reverse appliqué is a good option and why
- providing examples of needle turned and raw edge reverse appliqué technique and when each is better
- · showing a piece, with lessons learned
- discussing and demonstrating different products used for reverse appliqué, including starch, fusible and glue.

Finally, she will provide a pattern we can use to try reverse appliqué at home.



Location: The Jeffersonian, 10617 Taylorsville Rd, Louisville, KY 40299

You will need a color photo printed on 8 1/2 by 11 inch paper. If your photo is small, find a scanner/printer and enlarge it to fit the full page. It can be any photo, hopefully not too complicated, such as a flower, a bird, your house, your cat, or even a page from a magazine or catalog that you like.

- A fine point sharpie, a pencil, chalk, or frixon marker to mark your fabric
- Freezer paper
- Scraps of fabric, batiks, solid or nearly solid of colors in your photo. (We can share.)
- A piece of batting and a piece of background appox. 12x14 inches.
 We are making a small piece, so you don't need much.
- A bobbin filled with clear monofilament thread

- Several thread spools in colors to match your photo
- Your sewing machine with a free motion foot, usual sewing supplies.
 You will need small sharp scissors. A cutting mat and rotary cutter will not be needed.
- A glue stick or glue basting, or liquid fuse (my preference)
- Iron, pressing sheet, small ironing pad. (We can share this, too).

History Stitched in Quilts

Filson Historical Society, 1310 S. 3rd St. - Aug. 2nd, Noon - 1 p.m.

This program will feature the quilts in the Filson's collection, representing nearly 200 years of history. Each quilt has a story to tell. By looking at the patterns, materials, methods and technologies used to make the quilts, we can uncover personal narratives of the women and men who made them, as well as discover broader social, economic and cultural histories of the Ohio River Valley. Several quilts will be brought out from storage for visitors to examine in person.

Heartland of Kentucky Quilt Show - 20th Year Pritchard Community Center, 404 S. Mulberry St, Elizabethtown, KY Friday, Sept. 27th, 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. | Saturday, Sept. 28th, 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Approximately 400 quilts made by local artists will be on display, including Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society (KHQS) quilts and Hoffman Challenge Quilts. There will also be how-to demos throughout both days, vendors, prize drawings and more.

Quilt displays, with narration, will be shown both days during the bed turning.

Featured Member: Linda Bartlett

I joined LNT in March of this year and I am so glad I did! I wasn't quite sure what I was getting into, but I am so glad I joined. I love seeing other people's quilts, learning new techniques and helping others through quilting. I felt right at home at LNT the first day I joined.

I started quilting about 25 years ago when one of my co-workers wanted to test out her teaching skills and was looking for a volunteer. It was such a fun experience. She showed me how to put together a single block and then how to make a table runner. I've been working on quilts ever since and have never tired of it.

Most of the quilts I make are given to family members. Even now, my grandkids ask me "who's getting that quilt" with that look in their eye, as I work on putting a new quilt together! No two quilts are the same. I like going from one pattern to another for each quilt. All my quilts are machine pieced and hand quilted. I think scrap quilts have become my favorites. I commandeered a corner of my basement for my "happy place" (sewing room). It's nothing fancy but it's somewhere I can spread out all my stuff and sew.

Looking forward, I want to see how long arm quilting is done and learn how to free motion quilt. And I think my next new endeavor is making a crazy quilt with embellishments! Or, maybe paper piecing, or maybe QAYG, or..... so many things, so little time!



Tips & Tricks: Ironing Boards

Whether using a traditional ironing board or portable pressing surface, here are a few tips you should consider.

- 1. Make sure the ironing board is positioned so that you don't have to hunch over. If standing, it should be at belly-button height.
- 2. Need more ironing surface for quilt tops/backs? Consider building or buying a rectangular cover for you ironing board or table.
- 3. Avoid using a silver-color, Teflon-coated cover, as this reflects the heat rather than allowing steam to pass completely through your fabric pieces.
- 4. Avoid lots of batting/padding. Quilt blocks will press better on a firm surface.
- 5. For crisp seams, consider using a tailor clapper to wick out moisture.

Tips & Tricks: Scaling Paper-Pieced Templates

If you have a paper-piecing template, but it's not the exact size you need, try this:

- 1. First, there is a **Proportional Scale**. This scale is simple to use and with the desired finished block size and the actual finished block size, you can easily find the percentage needed to enlarge or reduce the pattern or template on your printer. Be sure to adjust your seam allowance to a scant 1/4" after you've scaled the block size, as it will also scale with your adjustment.
- 2. Or, for those that are not afraid of a little math, there is a simple equation:

desired finished block size (inches or centimeters)

----- x 100 = resizing percentage

actual finished block size (inches or centimeters)

Tips & Tricks: Snowball Corners

from Angela Huffman, as seen on "Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting" show.

If you are snowballing the corners of a block, only trim the back of the snowball piece - don't trim the original block. That way, if your snowball isn't quite square, you can still use the original block as a guide when you sew the rest of your pieces together. It really doesn't add that much bulk to the quilt top.
