Needle News submitted by Marilou

Change your needle after each project.

If the needle makes a thumping noise, the tip is dull or broken; change it If it breaks the thread, it is either broken or it may be inserted the wrong way. If it skips stitches or puckers the fabric; change it.



Size

- Match your needle size to your fabric. Use a jeans needle for denim, a size 10 or 12 for regular stitching on quilting fabric, size 14 or 16 for heavier thread on canvas or duck.
- The flat side of the shank goes 'away' from you toward the back of the machine, or sometimes to the left
- Needle packages labeled 'universal' will fit any machine.


Twin Needles

 Double needles are actually two needles on one shaft used to create two rows of stitches simultaneously. Use two spools of thread and one bobbin thread. They come in many sizes, the difference being the width between the needles.

Match your thread content to your fabric content

80/20 cotton/poly fabric - use cotton/poly thread
 100% cotton fabric - use 100% cotton thread

silk fabric - use silk thread.

Quilts Recorded for Posterity

Nimble Thimbles partnered with Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society on April 1 to record the information and history of fifteen quilts. Seven of them were quilts owned by our own members; two belonged to Sandy Shawhan, two to Sara Jane Lynch, and one each to Susan Wolfe, Sylvia Gibson, and Julie Mackell. Linda Slye organized the event and kept everything moving smoothly.

Saturday, April 1 was official Quilt Registration Day when the old quilts were photographed and the facts (who, what, when and where) were recorded. The information will be filed at The Folk Life Archive at Western Kentucky University where it can be accessed at khqs.org.

Certified Quilt Appraiser Vickie Coleman led a team of quilters who studied each quilt and identified fabrics, colors or style that indicated the approximate date it was made. It was then hung on a frame and officially photographed.

The interviewers talked to each owner and recorded such facts as the maker's name, date of birth, and where the quilt was made; stories about the quilt such as who it was made for, whether it was sewn by machine or by hand, and how the owner came to have the quilt. Each owner received a printed label, including their id number, to sew onto the back.

The day-long event was held at the Southwest Regional Library and more than fifteen LNT members participated to make it a great success. There are plans to hold the event annually.



M.J. Kinman's Trunk Show & Workshop Descriptions

1-Session Workshop (approx. 6 hours)

Using the design and piecing techniques I rely on to create my giant gemstone quilts students will create their own singularly beautiful work of faceted light. Freezer paper piecing techniques are powerful techniques that can transform any quiltmaker's ideas into reality. This is NOT foundation paper piecing! Instead, this is *traditional piecing* using freezer paper as your template.

Over the course of a single day-long session, students will learn how to:

- Create a freezer paper pattern based on a mock-up of a bite-size gem that I provide.
- Understand how different types of fabrics impact the flow of light and color across their design.
- Assemble the fabric facets to create their own 18"-square mini-quilt of faceted color.

Activities include:

- Prepare an 18" square freezer paper template.
- Transfer the mock-up design to the freezer paper by using a simple grid technique.
- Create a color palette.
- Code the facets in their template to designate position, color, and adjacency.
- Cut apart their freezer paper template and sort by color code.
- Iron freezer paper facets to their painted fabric according to the color codes.
- Cut the facets and organize them by section code.
- Learn techniques to piece facets.

Supply List:

- Note: MJ will bring freezer paper for members to use. However, if students wish to purchase their own, they can do so by purchasing it at their local grocery store OR from Amazon. The freezer paper should be 18" wide.
- Colored pencils in the colors of the gem they want to create.
- Highlighter
- Regular pencils
- Ball point pen or permanent markers
- Eraser
- Bic Wite-Out tape or similar brand (Please do not purchase a bottle of Liquid Paper/Liquid Wite-Out since it will make a mess on your iron.)
- 18" ruler & Small ruler with a 1/4" measurement
- 6-8 business-size envelopes
- Domestic sewing machine and thread assortment (neutrals or colors that match your fabrics)
- Scissors and rotary cutting tools (cutter and mat) Bring 2 rotary cutters if you want to cut paper with one and your fabric with another.
- Iron and ironing pad (or board)
- Fabric Fat Quarters of cotton solids or gradients. Consider bringing a range of values (light, medium, dark) within one or two colorways. This project works best when you have a very dark value, a very light value, and a range of 2 or 3 medium values. White and black also work well to bump up the "bling" in your gem.



Marilou's Christmas Challenge for 2023

You are encouraged to find a new and interesting way to interpret the Christmas spirit. It can be funny, beautiful, inspirational; modern, traditional, or art.

The *challenge* is to use any color combinations EXCEPT red <u>and</u> green.

- 1. You may use either red OR green, <u>but not both</u>. That means <u>no</u> Christmas fabric that contains both red and green
- 2. Minimum size 160" perimeter. You could make a wall hanging, lap quilt, or something of your choice.
- 3. Must be quilted and bound or pillowcase edged.

There is a \$5 fee to enter and that will be the grand prize. 2nd and 3rd places will receive ribbons.

Participants will be asked to bring their completed quilts to the Christmas Party on December 7 where they will be displayed and the **Viewers' Choice** judging will take place.
